

What advice do you give to final year law students preparing for their next career step?



Recruitment Process



✓ APPLICATION TIPS

- Ensure you include all information that has been requested as part of the application process.
- Applications for W+K will need to include a cover letter, CV and academic transcript.
- Ensure your cover letter gets you noticed, and makes you remembered:
 - Who are you, what experience do you have, and what are you interests? Make it personable.
 - Why are you wanting to work at W+K?
 - Why do you think you would be a good fit for W+K?

✓ INTERVIEW PREP TIPS

- Research our firm to ensure this is a place where would like to start your career https://www.wottonkearney.com.au/
- Leave plenty of time for travel so you are not rushed.
- Prepare your own questions to ask. Remember this is also for you to find out about us and whether your values align with ours and if this is the right place for you.

✓ INTERVIEW TIPS

- Leave plenty of time for travel so you are not rushed.
- Listen carefully to the question. It is ok to take a moment and consider it before answering or you can ask the interviewer to rephrase the question if you are unsure.
- Try not let the nerves get the better of you. This is your opportunity to showcase yourself and everything you have achieved.
- Remain positive and be yourself.



Frequently Asked Questions

How many graduate roles will be available?

The number of roles will depend on our resourcing needs at the time. However, generally we hire 2-3 graduates in each office each year.

Applications will open in March 2023, with successful candidates starting full time employment by 7 February 2024.

Do I need to have completed my Law Degree before I can apply?

You should be in your final year when you apply. You will need to have completed your University studies prior to 7 February 2024.

You can attend your Graduation and complete your Professionals studies after your employment start date. We will pay for your professionals course fees.

Do I need to complete an insurance law paper to apply?

While completing an insurance law paper would be advantageous to your application, you do not need to have completed this paper to be a successful candidate.

What does the graduate remuneration package look like?

Our salary bands are reviewed annually, with increases back-dated to 1 July. Our current banding has Graduates starting on \$60,000, moving to \$72,000 after 1 year at the firm.

Additional benefits include:

- Health insurance contributions
- Income protection and life insurance
- Birthday leave + Wellness Leave provisions
- Gym / sporting contributions
- Kiwisaver contributions (on top of salary)
- Payment of Professionals and admission costs (+ study leave)

How do you support progression and development?

Our junior lawyer technical training programme has been designed to kick-start your legal career. It has been developed by our lawyers, with a specialist focus on insurance litigation.

You can expect regular dedicated junior lawyer training workshops during your first 6 months at W+K, in addition to fortnightly CLE training sessions for all lawyers. Examples of our junior lawyer training workshops include:

- Introduction to Insurance
- Structured sessions on our key practice areas
- Chronologies and discovery
- The lifecycle of insurance claims
- Scale Costs
- Filing and Serving of Documents
- Drafting Pleadings
- Case Law Research

Outside of our technical training programme, we have a three tiered mentoring approach which assigns all graduates with a **Kaitiaki** (supervising partner) **Senior Mentor** (senor lawyer) and **Buddy** (junior lawyer) to help guide you through your first year at the Firm.

You will have quarterly catch ups with your Kaitiaki where you will discuss your development and agree objectives to work towards. You will also have regular catch ups with your Senior Mentor.

You will be supported in developing goals and objectives to help you reach your full potential.

How do you choose which practice area graduates will work in?

Graduate lawyers will spend their first 3 years rotating through our various practice areas to ensure they get exposure in all areas of our business. You will get to work with various specialists over this time.
